Honorable minister Plasterk,

By means of this letter I would want to make a strong and serious appeal to the council of ministers to revisit there decision. Soon we will be voting on a referendum that will have serious implications on our present status and I feel that everyone that lives on this island

should be eligible to cast their vote. Of course I respect the electoral laws when it has to do with non national's having to be residing on the island for a certain amount of years.

As a faction in the present island council constellation representing the United Peoples Coalition we aren't narrow minded like some other patties that what could be the outcome if these person would be given the permission to vote. We are very democratic and also are aware of the fact that in some countries there is absolutely no voting rights for certain groups.

Mr. Plasterk as the minister of interior affairs and kingdom relations I'm directing this letter to expecting a reaction with the option for further deliberation with the government of statia on this matter. Don't let us continue to feel that because we are small in quantity you don't care about us.

How about using this as a start of giving us the people on a broader scale some extra autonomy in this form.

Mr. Plasterk don't let history repeat it's self were people already has the impression that there opinion doesn't count.

Close this letter of appeal by requesting your serious attention for the contents hereof and expect an constructive reaction coming from your cabinet with the desire of the people in mind.
