RESOLUTION OF THE SENATE

Delivered on the 13th session held on 4th April 2018

on the interoperability between EU information systems

The Senate

I.

1. Supports

Commission's proposals on establishing a framework for interoperability between the EU information systems with the aim to improve the management of the Schengen external borders, the migration management and to contribute to the internal security of the EU;

2. Agrees

with the Position of the Government on the documents;

II.

1. Recalls

that it is important to reach a balance between the effectiveness of the systems in the new interoperability framework, so as the systems can fulfil their objectives, and the level of personal data protection;

2. Points out

that the project is financially demanding and that it is necessary to ensure utmost effectiveness of the financial planning and spending during the implementation of the proposed actions;

3. Emphasizes,

in accord with the Government, that the proposals will have an immense impact on the national information systems and it is, therefore, necessary to provide sufficient time frame for the adaptation of national systems;

4. Supports

the Government's position that it is important to have in mind the needs of the end users in the course of further negotiations regarding the proposals;

III.

1. Requests

the Government to inform the Senate about the way this resolution was taken into account and about further development of negotiations once the political agreement of the required number of Member States on the main elements of the proposals is reached, or at an earlier time, should the results of negotiations in the Council begin to depart considerably from the position of the Czech Republic expressed in the General Position of the Government;

2. Authorizes

the President of the Senate to forward this resolution to the European Commission.
